Colin Anderson updated SES Tran presentation – no response to letter sent

Consultation on the Tram Extension -

No response has been received from the project team. A reminder to all, the closing date for the online consultation is 17 November 2025. Colin did attend a EACC meeting and there was a presentation on the Tram Project. Costs are projected at 2.9 billion not including compensation for individuals or traders who could be impacted by the work on Queensferry Road and Orchard Brae. Major engineering work would be required on the Dean Bridge. At the present time more than 4500 responses have been received with regard to

- Signage inadequate although it was recognised it was an emergency situation. Passers by could smell gas.
- 2. No signage on the bus stops that a diversion was in place. Passengers who did not have access to the app were standing at the bus stop until someone passing updated them. The bus

5. Lothian Buses were only stopping at some of the stops from Greenbank Crescent to

- tracker showed bus times. 3. Some drivers did not see the signs or were ignoring.
- 4. Stella said she witnessed a situation where a driver did a handbrake turn to avoid the bollards
 - on Comiston Road.
- Fairmilehead Crossroads. Some passengers aware of diversion had assumed it would stop at all the bus stops to Fairmilehead Crossroads. They were not able to alight from the bus until it reached the crossroads.

Colin has already written to Lothian Buses and Scottish Gas Networks (SGN) and is awaiting further responses. However, it was agreed there should be a policy in place in the unlikely event there was a closure of Comiston Road. Colin is taking this forward with Lothian Buses.

Councillor Savage

Colin advised the Councillor had to leave to attend another engagement and he would provide his update. Councillor Savage said he had received queries on fly tipping and crime and burglaries which he was addressing. Amanda said someone was camping near a barrier at Dreghorn

Barracks. This same issue was previously discussed with Scott Arthur MP. At that time, he was concerned with anyone camping near the army barracks. Connor said he would review. Amanda

will send an update to Connor. A question was asked about pot holes and Connor advised there was finite funding available but he has flagged the issue.

Mike thanked Stella for her advert in the Directory. Survey is open to everyone in the household. Hopefully others can help people who are not online.

Nursing Home Winton Drive

Colin said only 12 underground parking spaces are available and it is thought these will not be sufficient for the numbers visiting or working in the home. It is expected the home will open by

March 2026. The residents in the area are fed up with the number of vans parked in the area as they are a danger to other road users. Colin accepted these were valid points but the battle had been lost at

the planning stage. It was suggested continued monitoring take place. Scott Arthur MP had

suggested monitoring when the home opened. However, the process for yellow lines is long and cumbersome and can take 18 months to 2 years. Mike asked if we could call for a TRO. Colin said we could make representation. However, he

thought they would say no action could be taken until the home opened and issues arose. Colin will investigate.

White lines Frogston Road West It was pointed out the white lines at the junction of Frogston road West and Buckstone Terrace

need repainting. This is important due to the number of visitors using Mortonhall Caravan Park. Councillor Cuthbert said this should be taken up with Clarence at Edinburgh Council. He said a particular format is needed to update the website and at the present time it is not working! Councillor Cuthbert said a meeting has been arranged with the council regarding lack of paint and road safety.

Councillor Cuthbert said the committee were aware several planning objections especially by email had the same objection and tone. They will consider if this should be treated as 1 objection for reaching the threshold referral limit to the management committee.

A question was asked regarding the disposal of the land by the Water Board. Colin advised the whole site would be sold with the exception of The Pump House as it is still operational. Sewers and wayleaves would also be retained.

Transport and Environment

Biggar Road

Fairmilehead Crossroads and the By Pass. (A copy of the Council email was included with the agenda papers.) There is also a proposal for a pedestrian crossing at the Lothianburn Roundabout which would improve road safety and reduce speeding. A701 Relief Road Midlothian Council

Councillor Cuthbert said a Pedestrian Crossing will be installed on Biggar Road between the

The Proposed Road will go from A702 Boghill Farm, cross over A703(Penicuik) and join Straiton Junction. The project includes plans for cycle lanes to encourage alternative transport. The estimated cost of the project is £55 million. The residents of Damhead are incensed by the proposal. However, if the proposal goes forward it is expected to relieve the A702 at Hillend; the project once funded should take 3-5 years to complete.

Councillor Cuthbert said the CEC Transport Committee supported the proposal as part of the City Deal which has funds available. It is for Midlothian Council as Planning Authority to decide on the plans. Midlothian Council is the fastest growing council in Scotland.

Liberton community Council are not commenting on the application.

Colin said 120million is set aside for an upgrade at Sherriffhall Roundabout. Land has to be purchased and no decision has been made on the Report sent to the Scottish Government over 2 years ago. It is estimated the project would take 3/4 years and the costs will have increased

Mike said the Cabinet Secretary had announced all objections needed to be reviewed. The Scottish Greens also object to the proposals. It is believed there are over 2000 objections but it is thought some 1800 of the objections came from the same party. Do not expect a decision until after the May election.
